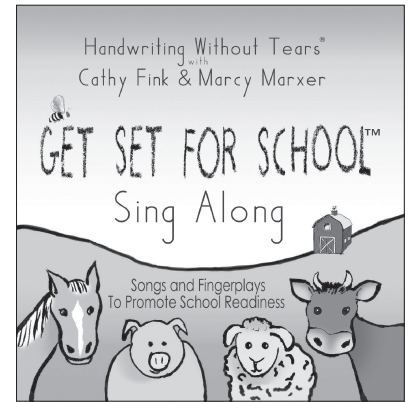


MUSIC AND MOVEMENT

Music is a big part of our readiness curriculum. You can use the award winning *Get Set For School Sing Along* CD to teach positional concepts, body parts, and letter formation. Whether you are teaching how to build Mat Man or how to count animal legs, this CD has all you need to charge up your lessons and catch your students' attention. The lyrics are on the jacket cover of the CD. The following is a list of suggested activities for each song.



Track #	Song	Suggested Activities
1	Where Do You Start Your Letters?	Play a question and answer game with students. Move to the song: reach to the top, bottom, and point to the middle. Share the song with parents.
2	Alphabet Song	It is fun to sing ABCs with others in a large group. Follow the children on the CD. They sing every letter clearly, even L M N O P! Sing while pointing to Pre-K Wall Cards in the classroom. Sing while pointing to alphabet pages in the <i>Get Set for School</i> workbook. Try singing the ABCs with the instrumental version.
3	Alphabet Song Instrumental	Sing it on your own!
4	There's a Dog in School	Here's a chance to say the alphabet from a dog's point of view. This song will have your students barking the alphabet and laughing at the same time!
5	Crayon Song	Children learn to pick up a crayon. Then they gently drop it and do it again. They love to drop. Teaching proper grip has never been so easy or so much fun. Children enjoy learning that their fingers have important jobs!
6	Magic C	Making C s and circles is easy when the teacher sings and shows children what to do. Children will remember which way to go. Write C s and circles in the air.
7	Hello Song	It's time to learn this important social skill. Children learn to look, to smile, and to shake hands with the right hand. Now it's easy to know which is the right hand.
8	Mat Man	This song helps children build Mat Man as a group. Mat Man teaches body parts, body functions, and simple counting. After building Mat Man, children learn to draw him too.
9	Count on Me	It's easy to help children count body parts. We are symmetrically made and our two body parts are on our two sides. The body parts that we have just one of go down the center of our bodies (nose, mouth, belly button).
10	Five Fingers Play	Fingers and toes are in units of five. Children count to 5 with this fun fingerplay.

Track #	Song	Suggested Activities
11	Toe Song	Children know and love the classic toe play, "This little piggy..." This new song is fun too.
12	Bird Legs	No matter what they look like or what they do, birds have two! " 2 4 6 8 , We're counting legs so don't be late!"
13	Animal Legs	Play the CD and then make up your own personalized versions with new names and new animals. There are lots of four-legged animals!
14	The Ant, the Bug & the Bee	Learn 6 with insect legs. Don't forget to let children fly around like bees.
15	Spiders Love to Party	It's fun to sing and dance around the room and think of spiders having 8 legs.
16	Ten Little Fingers	Finger-plays are perfect for developing fine motor and imitating skills. This will be a favorite.
17	My Teacher Draws	Children love to have grown-ups draw for them. Watching the teacher draw prepares children for drawing.
18	Puffy Fluffy	Move to music. Make clouds and rain in the air.
19	Tap, Tap, Tap	Use two big lines to tap. Children can follow the rhythm and imitate the teacher's motions.
20	Golden Slippers (Instrumental)	Use two big lines for tapping. This upbeat instrumental was added for extra practice tapping. Children can imitate the teacher's movements and tapping patterns. Change movement when the music changes.
21	Skip to My Lou	Use this song as a gross motor activity. Each verse has a different gross motor movement. Use this song to teach the concept of start/stop. The music freezes between verses.
22	Down on Grandpa's Farm	Sing before taking a field trip to a farm or while learning about farms and animals. Add new verses naming animals and sounds you hear on a farm.
23	Peanut Butter and Jelly	Encourage a variety of movements, listening, and following directions.
24	Rain Song	Imitate falling rain motions.
25	Wood Piece Pokey	Move Wood Pieces up, down, and all around.
